Prospectus:

Most of us, whether religious or not, have a fixed mental image of Jesus Christ drawn from historic depictions. These mental images are often based on cultural stereotypes, political circumstance, and theological interpretation. However, a race- or gender-specific depiction of Jesus is limiting. In life, Jesus' aim was to banish racial, social, and class distinctions. Jesus is, symbolically, "all in all"—everyman, everyperson. What is your visual interpretation of Jesus? Are your images of Jesus literal, metaphorical, or something else entirely? Berkeley Community Church (United Church of Christ) invites artists to use their chosen media to address their perspective.

BCC is an integral part of its neighborhood, offering a community garden, providing park clean-ups, hosting space for events and classes

Submission Guidelines:

Process – Ms. Cullen will choose individual pieces based on technical application, originality, and interpretation of the concept. We are looking for fresh and new interpretations of this historic icon! Works that interpret the subject matter in an exceptional manner visually, as well as intellectually, will be selected and awarded.

Artwork selected for this show will be on display for one year with the option to sell. Buyers will take possession at the end of the year.

Criteria – This show is open to all artists, secular (no religious affliation necessary) submissions are encouraged. Accepted mediums: painting, drawing, printmaking, sculpture, fiber, photography and digital art. Simply put, all genres are welcome! Size limit is approximately 5x5 maximum, flexible to medium. Accepted works must be properly prepared using braided wire, professionally presented, and ready to hang. Sculptures must include instructions for display. Additional framing/ hanging/display requirements or idiosyncracies will be emailed to accepted artists.

Liability – Berkeley Community Church (BCC) will take all due precautions to protect the art. However, BCC is not responsible for loss due to damage, theft, vandalism or accident. If work is especially fragile, it is submitted at the artist's own risk. Artist is responsible for his/her own insurance.

After notification and end of show, any artwork not picked up by designated deadlines will be considered abandoned. Abandoned artwork will be considered property of BCC and may be sold to cover storage fees. Please insure we have good contact information to avoid this.

Submission Fee - \$25 per piece, no more than 3 pieces submitted by any individual artist. Payments may be made in cash or check made payable to Berkeley Community Church, c/o Jill Carstens, 3701 W. 50th Ave, Denver, CO 80221. **Submission fee is due upon drop-off of artwork**.
